Diploma in Pastoral Theology

Two-year part-time course Next in-take September

The course will take you on a journey into the discipline of pastoral theology, where theology is applied to ministry. As well as the academic texts on which the course is based, your own life experience will be a valuable text book which you bring to the programme.

What is the purpose of the course?

The main aim of this course is to equip people for skilled and supervised active lay ministry within a parish or church community. The course is knowledge and skill based and grounded in experiential learning.

Is this course for me?

This course is offered to men and women from all walks of life who are involved in their parish communities or who would like to be. It sees participants' lived experience as complementary to the more formal input of the sessions and values the sharing of that experience as one of the great gifts participants can offer to each other.

The Structure of the Course

6 in-house input days per year

18 evening sessions via zoom per year

Placement in Years 1 and 2

There are three strands to the course:

- A Academic Input
- B Personal Study and Reflection
- C Pastoral Placement

During the course, participants will:

- study and reflect on Christian life and ministry,
- combine pastoral theology and the acquisition of skills with supervised experience in pastoral placements,
- develop the skills of theological reflection, so as to enable them to relate theology and ministry to everyday life,
- engage in ongoing formation of social, organisational, communication and leadership skills.

Help and support with the written aspects of the course is readily available.

Course Fees

£795 per year inclusive of Maynooth registration fee and lunch/refreshments on in-house days. Fees may be paid on an instalment basis. We are grateful to the Friends of Drumalis for their generous financial support of this course.

Entrance Requirements

Preference will be given to those who have completed the Certificate in Christian Thought or its equivalent and/or have extensive pastoral experience.

In addition to completing an application form, applicants will be asked to attend for interview.

We are in a transition time between the relative security and certainties of past times and discovering what the Spirit wants of the Church in Ireland today and tomorrow. It will be impossible for us to hold on to the ways we lived parish in the past. The parishes of tomorrow will be 'communities of intentional disciples' sustained by committed and formed lay people.
