"I hope your relationship to God and church has been shaped and sweetened by wisdom, discernment, and invitation. I really do hope your life in the church hasn't been a long, abusive slog through commandments and pronouncements that seemed to gag you and take away your freedom. If you've suffered at the hands of your teachers and have not been aided in your quest for God and guidance, please let me apologize on behalf of the church. It's not supposed to be this way."

"Christ's love remains as the true and only commandment of the new life, which the Christian, with the help of the Holy Spirit, makes his or her own day by day in a journey that never stops... Never turn away from this source of love, for it is the condition for being happy and full of joy always and in spite of everything."

This is the new life that sprang up in us on the day of Baptism and that we have the responsibility to share with everyone so that it can grow in each person and bear fruit."

By Road:

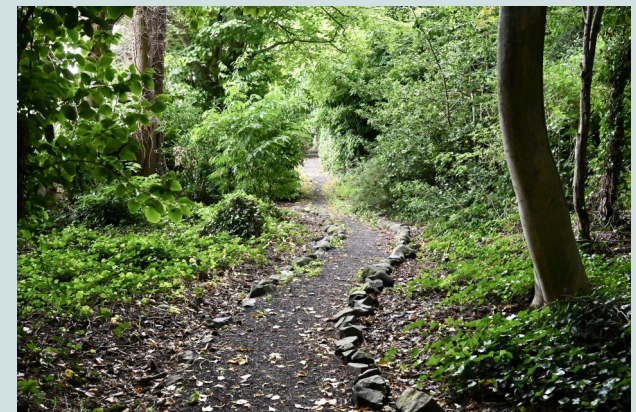

Date	Theme
4 Oct 25	Rediscovering Jesus. Who is your God? Our understanding and experience of God develops during our life experience. How can we open ourselves to a constant rediscovery of the person of Jesus along the journey of life? Fr John Friel CP is a Chartered Psychologist and member of the Daneo Services team based in Belfast.
8 Nov 25	An Introduction to the Bible An opportunity to have a fresh perspective on how we can approach the Sacred Scriptures as a fountain of wisdom, prayer and direction. What does it mean when we say that the Bible is the Word of God? Sean Goan is a scripture scholar who has the ability to break open God's Word in a way that has depth and freshness. Presenter of our popular retreat on the music of Leonard Cohen.
13 Dec 25	Pope Francis – A Man of his Word The world and our church lost a man of great wisdom and courage when we heard the news of the passing of the beloved Pope Francis. This day is an opportunity to look at the core teachings of Pope Francis and to reflect upon the gift that he was to both the church and to the world. Brian McKee is Director of Drumalis Retreat Centre. He has worked in retreats, youth ministry, peace and reconciliation and teaching for over 40 years.
10 Jan 26	The Call to be Builders of Peace and Justice This beautiful world is scarred by the obscenity of war and the sin of injustice. As followers of the Prince of Peace we cannot stay silent or choose to ignore, but what can we do to make a difference in the midst of such pain and suffering? Dr Gráinne Doherty is a retreat presenter and an adult faith educator. She was a member of the theology department in All Hallows College, Dublin, as well as holding a variety of roles in pastoral leadership roles at parish and diocesan levels.
14 Feb 26	Prayer – The Language of Love Life is experienced as difficult for many of us. Tough choices to be made, demands on our time, difficult relationships. Taking time aside to pray can seem like a luxury that we cannot afford, and yet listening to the message of love to which we open ourselves in prayer is the source to which we cannot afford to be disconnected.

14 Feb 26	Prayer – The Language of Love (<i>continued</i>) Maria Garvey is an experienced leader in education, health & social care, social enterprise and the faith community. Maria has brought her experience and knowledge to a wide range of individuals and organizations both nationally and internationally.
7 Mar 26	What does it mean to be a Synodal Church? Whatever your opinion about the church, few people would disagree that it is in a state of change. We hear new words and language that can be baffling, disappointing or exciting depending upon your viewpoint. Together we search for a new understanding of what the Spirit is asking of our Church today. Fr Gerry Clarke SJ is Director of the Belfast Jesuit Centre and chaplain to Ulster University. Fr Gerry formerly worked in the Jesuit Centre of Spirituality in Galway and spent some time working in Jesuit Refugee Ministries in Lebanon and Chad. Native of Dublin he joined the Jesuits in 1986.
18 Apr 26	Called and Chosen – Ministry in Times of Change Baptism affirms our genuine equality of dignity and action as we take up the call to ministry in the Church today. Ministry though is more than getting permission to carry out specific roles in the Church but about being full and active participants in the building of the Kingdom of God. How can we respond more effectively to this Call and to challenges we may face along the road? Brian McKee
16 May 26	Care for Our Common Home Laudato Sí is a call to follow a God-centred approach to environmental challenges that brings glory to the Creator, transformation of people and the land that sustains them. It focuses on care for the natural environment and all people, as well as broader questions of the relationship between God, humans, and the Earth. The encyclical's subtitle, "Care for Our Common Home," reinforces these key themes. Juanita Majury and Team. Juanita is a member of the Focolare Movement in Ireland and an active participant in the Joining the Dots Together project that brings together faith based groups to foster dialogue, promote ecological awareness and support practical steps towards sustainability. Her work is aimed at helping to build a more connected and compassionate response to the environmental challenges we face.
